Title: Department of Business and Trade: Key Account Management

Report Summary

The purpose of this report is to

- 1. Provide a background about the Department of Business and Trade (DBT) Key Account Management (KAM) programme.
- 2. Accept the latest grant funding award of £88,606.96, to deliver the KAM programme in North East of England from 01 October 2024 31 March 2025.
- 3. Approve the passporting of funds to Newcastle Gateshead Initiative, Northumberland County Council, North Tyneside Council, Gateshead Metropolitan Council, and South Tyneside Council to deliver the KAM programme.

Recommendations

In accordance with the Scheme of Delegations, the Director of Finance and Investment, in consultation with the Monitoring Officer, the Mayor and the relevant Cabinet Member, is recommended to:

- 1. Accept the grant funding of £88,606.96 from the Department of Business and Trade for the Key Account Management programme (for the period 01 October 2024 31 March 2025).
- 2. Approve the passporting of funds to Newcastle Gateshead Initiative, Northumberland County Council, North Tyneside Council, Gateshead Metropolitan Council, and South Tyneside Council to deliver the KAM programme.

A. Summary of Proposal

1. Background

- 1.1 The DBT KAM programme has been delivered in the North East of England since 2018. This has been in the form of a grant funding agreement between DBT and Invest North East England (INEE).
- 1.2 The North East Combined Authority (North East CA) is the relevant accountable body for INEE.
- 1.3 INEE is the strategic inward investment agency for North East CA. The INEE team acts as the regional inward investment resource in the North East of England and works collaboratively with its local authority partners and other key stakeholders to increase the levels of inward investment flowing into the region from both UK-owned and foreign-owned businesses.
- 1.4 The purpose of the DBT KAM grant is for the delivery of Key Account Management in the North East CA area that is additional to work that is currently delivered by DBT's central Strategic Relationship Management function. Only management of foreign owned companies not on the DBT One List (A-C) will be funded through this resource.
- 1.5 The objective of providing the grant is to deliver additional Foreign Direct Investment into the North East, by enabling INEE and delivery partners (subcontractors) to identify and engage existing foreign investors in the North East CA area to generate reinvestment in the region.
 - 1.6 Foreign owned companies managed via this programme must display a high propensity to grow and create new jobs.

- 1.7 The model that has been adopted is INEE enters the regional KAM contract with DBT. INEE leads on the business case development and bids for annual funds on behalf of the region, subcontracting with participating local authorities to deliver KAM to key foreign-owned companies located in the North East CA area.
- For governance, INEE hold a monthly Investment Gateway Meeting (IGM) with local authority inward investment leads and DBT. The group coordinates inward investment activities and makes decisions on day-to-day operational activity. INEE and IGM members agreed that INEE would subcontract the delivery of the KAM programme to the participating constituent local authorities.

2. The Investment Proposal

- 2.1 In the most recent round of funding, a total Grant amount of £345,991.00 has been awarded to North East CA (as INEE's accountable body), for the delivery of the KAM Programme from April 2023 March 2025. Grant funding has been awarded via a Grant Determination plus a Grant Addendum Notice (001) and Grant Addendum Notice (002).
- 2.2 This delegated decision is to accept specifically the funding in the Grant Addendum Notice (002) £88,606.96 which covers the period of 01 October 2024 31 March 2025.
- 2.3 A full breakdown of the grant funding:

2.4 The Grant is to fund three Full Time Equivalents (FTEs) of dedicated staff resource within the North East CA geography to engage existing foreign investors in their local authority area to generate additional reinvestment.

Subcontractor (Partner) Agreements

- 2.5 Following the Grant Addendum Notice (002), INEE agreed that funding of £84,000 will be split in the form of a Grant, between participating local authorities of:
 - Newcastle Gateshead Initiative
 - Gateshead Metropolitan Council
 - Northumberland County Council
 - North Tyneside Council
 - South Tyneside Council
- 2.6 The remainder £4,606.96 will be retained by INEE as a top slice for administration and facilitation.
- 2.7 Durham County Council and Sunderland City Council were consulted about the Grant but declined the offer.
- 2.8 The above sub-contractors will enter a Grant Funding Agreement with the North East CA (as the accountable body for INEE).
- 2.9 The Grant will part fund an FTE for each sub-contractor within the timescales specified. The dedicated members of staff will be delivering, substantive strategic account management throughout this agreement period.

2.10 The Grant and outputs for each partner is below (for the contracting period of 01 October 2024 – 31 March 2025):

- 2.11 KAM investment successes from the portfolio of companies managed, should be in addition to any investment successes delivered by sub-contractors as part of their business-as-usual activity.
- 2.12 Subcontractors will prepare monthly reports which are submitted to INEE. INEE then collates and submits a regional monthly report to DBT on activity and facilitates the invoicing.
- 2.13 The full amount of the Grant to subcontractors will be paid upon satisfactory reporting of outputs.

3. Outputs and Outcomes

Regional contract DBT and NECA (as the accountable body for INEE) for 2023/24 and 2024/25. To note: these outputs are the total outputs for the year rather than the contract period.
